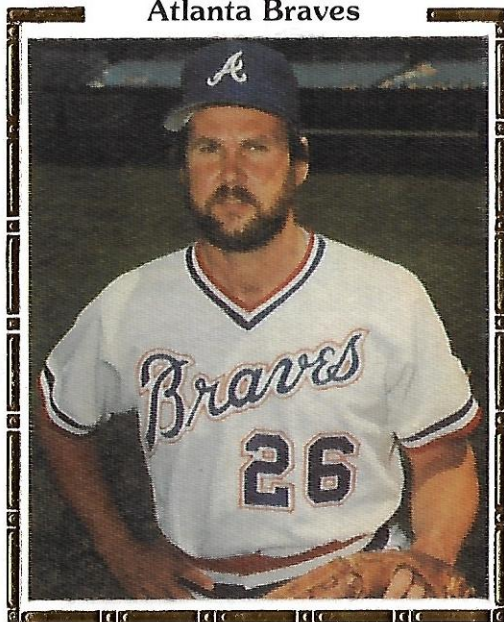


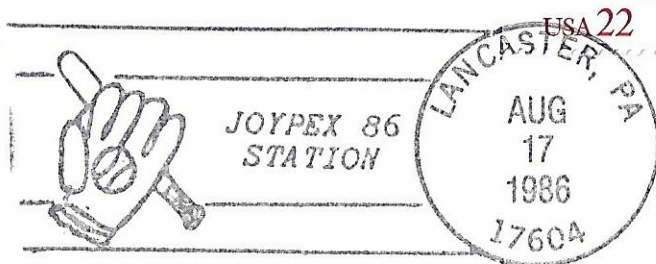

HENRY EUGENE GARBER (GENE)

Gene Garber was born November 13, 1947, in Lancaster, Pennsylvania. When he is not pitching for the Atlanta Braves, he calls Elizabethtown, Pennsylvania his home. Gene graduated from Elizabethtown Area High School in 1965. In 1969 he received an A.B. in History and Political Science from Elizabethtown College.

He began his professional baseball career with the Pittsburgh Pirates after being selected in the thirteenth round of the free-agent draft on June 14, 1965.

As his baseball career progressed, Gene was named International League's Pitcher of the Year in 1972. He was traded to the Kansas City Royals for pitcher Jim Rooker on October 25, 1972. On July 12, 1974, he was purchased by the Philadelphia Phillies. While a member of that club he tied the major league record for the most consecutive games won by a relief pitcher in games played May 15, 16, and 17, 1975. In that same year Gene led the National League in games finished in relief pitching with forty-seven (47) games.

Gene was traded to the Atlanta Braves for pitcher Dick Ruthven on June 15, 1978. In that same year he struck out Pete Rose to end Rose's forty-four (44) game hitting streak. Garber holds the Braves' club record for thirty (30) saves in 1982.

Presently Gene is in eleventh (11th) place for all time major league pitcher appearances and in sixth (6th) place for all time major league saves.
