Four persons from town were injured Sunday, one seriously, when two cars collided head-on in a heavy fog two miles east of Williamstown, Ohio.

Mr. and Mrs. Sheridan V. Angstadt, 108 W. Main St., daughter, June, and Mr. Angstadt's mother were returning from a vacation trip to Iowa when the accident occurred.

All four are patients in the Findley, Ohio, hospital. Mrs. Sheridan Angstadt had not regained consciousness at the time her daughter and son-in-law arrived at the Ohio hospital. She suffered a fractured skull, fractured hip and a demands.

Mr. Angstadt has a fractured leg and his mother suffered a severe gash entirely across her forehead. June Angstadt was badly shaken up but otherwise uninjured.

Mr. Sheridan was driving a 1941 Nash. The party had left here on the 13th for their vacation.

According to a hospital report received Wednesday evening by phone, Mrs. Sheridan Angstadt's condition remains serious. She has now regained consciousness. The condition of Mr. Angstadt, his mother and daughter were reported as good.
