You'll hear me call your name.*

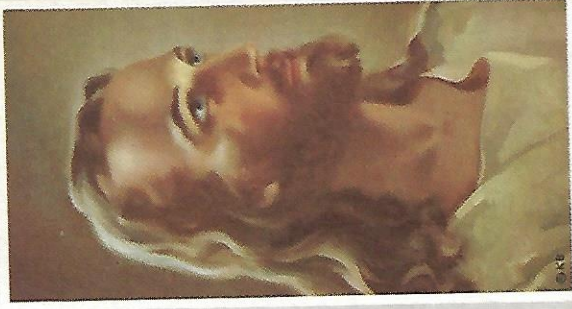
