## AUTO TRUCK RUN WAS A SUCCESS

BIG DEMONSTRATION GIVEN HERE ON SATURDAY—MR.
H. S. NEWCOMER ADDRESSES LARGE GATHERING

Auto trade dealers closed Saturday what they believe to have been the most successful truck show ever held in this county, and one of the most successful educational tours of the 100 going on throughout the country during the National "Ship-By-Truck" week.

Starting out on the last day of the tour, the caravan found crowds awaiting them in each town and were received with enthusiasm. The trips were made in record time, always arniving ahead of time for the meeting. Crowds, however, were always present waiting for the trucks to appear

The truck parade went first to Mountville, then visited Columbia, Marietta, Maytown, Elizabethtown, Mount Joy, Manheim and East Petersburg.

suggestion.


