A Destructive Fire In Leaman's Tire Shop Here Tuesday Night

Tires for passenger autos and trucks, tire recapping machines, camelback and other materials were destroyed by a fire which swept Leaman's Tire store, 208 E. Main St., and badly damaged an adjoining dwelling at 9:20 P. M. Tuesday. Damage is estimated at \$30,000.

Two children, Richard Shoop and Robert Zartman, who were asleep in the home of Mr. and Mrs. Irvin Zartman at 206 E. Main St., adjoining the store, were carried to safety when the blaze was discovered. Neighbors and firemen removed all personal belongings from the Zartman home except rugs, one of which had just been purchased.

(From Page 1) arms and hands and Robert Eshleman, severe lacerations of two fingers when slate fell upon his hand. A third casualty was an Elizabethtown fireman, slightly injured.

The blaze was discovered by Samirel Mateer, who resides opposite the store. He summoned William Coker, a part-time employe, who entered the building and found the blaze centered around some tires on the floor.

Smoke Hinders Firemen

Fed by rubber and combustible materials, the flames quickly spread to the partitions and to the second floor where large quantities of materials were stored. The dense smoke hindered firemen in fighting the blaze which broke through the roof of the tire store and spread to the Zartman home. Zartman, who works as a recapper for Leaman, moved his family to the home of a cousin, Arthur Koser, for the night.

George Leaman, who conducted the store, said everything was in order when he left the building at 6:15 P. M. The buildings, both two and one-half story brick are owned by Miss Helen and Miss Edith Myers, of Annville.

Fire Chief Ray Myers, of town, said the origin of the fire has not been determined.

The firemen deserve credit for the manner in which they handled the job. Friendship Fire Co., of this place, was assisted by the Rheems and Elizabethtown fire companies.




