FEBRUARY • MARCH • APRIL

- **Mardi Gras** •

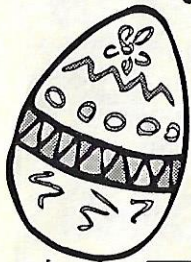
Hear about the history of this famous event. Each person will receive a string of Mardi Gras beads.

- **St. Patrick and Ireland** •

Ideal for a St. Patrick's Day program, this travelogue and lecture includes historical and religious background in addition to present day Ireland.

- **The Egg and Easter** •

Slides and display highlight this lecture on the origin of the decorated egg and how it has become known as the Easter Egg.



MAY • JUNE • JULY AUGUST

- **Herbs and the Tussie Mussie** •

The Tussie Mussie is the highlight of this lecture and display on herbs.

- **Where Do You Find Them** •

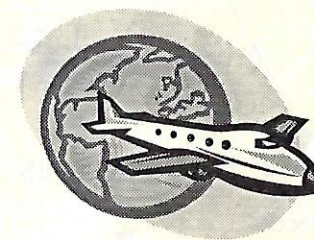
